

Personalized Learning Guide Guidelines & Rubric

EF's project guidelines and corresponding rubric are used to assess student projects created with the Personalized Learning Guide for prizes and recognition.

Complete projects include a cover image and title, a guiding question answered through a video project, and a conclusion. All sources must be properly cited. Each category will be assessed individually, and a final grade is determined by calculating the average.

High school credit is available to U.S. students in grades 6–12.

- Explain your question and its relevance to the world
- Reflect on your experience and connect it to your own life
- Provide evidence captured while traveling (i.e. interviews, observations, pictures)
- Bring your story to life in an engaging, organized way that leads to your conclusion

Each project should include a 5–8 minute video and:

- Show awareness and understanding of other cultures
